Like the Transfiguration, the Lord's Supper is a promise of future glory. It's a foretaste of the joy that awaits us. But there are significant differences too:

- The apostles went up a high mountain, but here we have entered into the heavenly sanctuary.
- On the mount of Transfiguration, Peter, James & John caught a glimpse of the glorified Savior, but here at the Table we actually share in the benefits the Savior has secured for us.
- The Father's voice from heaven commanded the three apostles to listen to Jesus, but here at this memorial feast we are the ones calling on the Father to remember Jesus for our sake.
- The disciples were warned not to speak a word about what they saw, but we are now charged to proclaim the Lord's death until He comes in the fullness of His splendor and glory.

All who have been baptized into Christ and seeking to live faithfully and obediently for Him are welcome to partake of this banquet Christ has prepared for us.
