Ninth Lord's Day after Pentecost

August 11, 2019

Psalm 2 ends with the terrifying warning that the wrath of the Son is quickly kindled against those who rebel against Him, but there is a sweet gospel promise that all who take refuge in Him will be blessed.

The Lord's Table is one of the most tangible ways that promise is impressed upon us. In this Holy Communion, the broken body and the shed blood of our Savior tell us loud and clear that God's wrath against us has been satisfied at the cross. We must always fear God, but we need not fear His wrath because He who knew no sin became sin for us that we might become the righteousness of God in Him. When we come to the Lord's Table, we come to take refuge in our Savior. We come to receive His life and blessing. And that's exactly what we are promised when receive these gifts in faith.

If you've been baptized into Christ and are seeking to live faithfully and obediently for Him, you are invited to partake of this feast that our gracious Father has provided for us. These are the gifts of God for the people of God.
