## **Eucharistic Homily**

Twenty-Fourth Lord's Day after Pentecost November 24, 2019

When call the sacrament of the Table "Holy Communion", we are acknowledging that the same Jesus whose body was broken and whose blood was poured out is also alive and well and reigning over all things at the right hand of God. In other words, for us to have "Holy Communion" with our Savior through His body and blood, he must be alive—and have a body.

This sacramental meal proclaims the Lord's death <u>and</u> His resurrection, and our participating in Holy Communion is a reaffirmation of God's promise that our bodies will be raised in glory and that we will share in God's new creation.
