Sixth Lord's Day of Epiphany

February 16, 2020

John tells us that the Samaritan woman met Jesus at the well at the sixth hour, which is twelve noon. Jesus offered to quench her thirst with living water, but she wanted to know where Jesus would get this living water. Jesus never answered.

In John 19, we're told that Jesus was sentenced to death at...the sixth hour. And as he hung on the cross, the source of living water cried out "I thirst." After He died, the soldiers pierced Jesus' side and blood and water flowed out.

In His unfathomable love, the Savior suffered thirst—and so much more—for us to provide us with living water and new life from above. The love of our Savior is so deep and so wide that He died our death to give us His life. He poured His life out for the life of the world, and now He invites us to receive His life anew in this Holy Communion.

If you've been baptized into Christ and are seeking to live faithfully and obediently for Him, you are invited to partake of this feast that our gracious God has provided for us. These are the gifts of God for the people of God.
